Dear Lorne,

Thank you for your letter of 17th February, 1982 and for the MT.3 protocol. I am glad you will be presenting the updated results in April at St. Louis. Please do include [Mr. Doe]. I saw him yesterday. He has just recovered from a chest infection but is well, and still maintains a Hb of 11.5 g/dl, platelet counts above  $200 \times 10^9/l$ , and leucocytes above  $2.5 \times 10^9/l$ . Last week I gave him only 400 mg of cyclophosphamide, and he had no injection the week before at the height of his infection. Samples of serum and urine taken yesterday have gone to Professor Hobbs for immunoglobulin and paraprotein follow up (you will recall that the last estimation suggested a light increase in the urinary light chain excretion). I will let you know the results. I think you are right to consider preparing a second paper, and it would be nice if we were co-opted as authors, now that you and Lyonel have had the first paper accepted. I expect you will now have heard from Eve and Daniel about their patients.
